1. Conferences and workshops coorganised in cooperation with LetsMT!

1.1. Formal Approaches to South-Slavic and Balkan Languages (FASSBL7)

This conference is a biannual international conference focused on South Slavic and Balkan languages. It was transferred to Croatia in 2008 and it will take place in Dubrovnik in several future iterations co-organised jointly by FFZG, Croatian Language Technologies Society and Bulgarian Academy of Sciences together with several international projects. In this year edition of the conference (4-6 October 2010) project LetsMT! and project ACCURAT were selected as coorganisers. This also gave them the opportunity to present the project goals and achievements at the conference.

The conference is the successor of the five previous FASSBL conferences held in Bulgaria (up to 2006) and in Dubrovnik (2008).

1.2. Human Language Technologies – the Baltic Perspective

The main aim of this conference is to provide a forum for the sharing of new ideas and recent advances in human language processing and to promote cooperation between the research communities of computer science and linguistics from the Baltic countries and the rest of the world.

The conference aims to bring together scientists, developers, providers and users to discuss state-of-the-art of HLT in the Baltic countries, to exchange information and to discuss problems, to find new synergies and to promote initiatives for international cooperation.

Central themes of this year conference were:

- Language resources and technology for the Humanities
- Building and using corpora for Machine Translation

The conference is the successor of the three previous Baltic HLT conferences held in Riga (2004), Tallinn (2005) and Kaunas (2007).
